Only one of two institutes at the U of I System level, IGPA is the place where top-quality, objective research and public policy meet. We catalyze experts from all three universities, reaching across the system to make all of our work count in impactful ways in the real world and to broaden the reach and impact of the University of Illinois System's work.

In this role, I have

- Launched a Task Force on COVID-19's Impact on the State at University of Illinois President Tim Killeen's request, comprised of 55 faculty across all three universities
- Increased the historical publication rate of IGPA faculty by 250%
- Instituted a "warm hand-off" of policy analyses to state lawmakers, the Governor's offices, members of the executive branch, members of Congress, local officials and key stakeholders, ensuring uptake with relevant decision-makers and leading to real-world impacts
- Catalyzed interdisciplinary teams of scholars to examine some of the thorniest questions facing us, including the effect of race on Access to Justice and COVID's impacts on real people by assembling Citizen-Scientists
- Through this work, influenced legislation, such as the Illinois Legislative Back Caucus' landmark 2020 anti-racism legislation

- Secured an Intergovernmental Agreement with the Illinois Department of Human Services to assist five separate commissions and Task Forces to ground recommendations in a sound evidence-based understanding of human needs, the “winning proposal” in a competitive Request for Proposals process
- Drawn significant resources to IGPA:
  - \$500,000 MacArthur grant to extended work on Citizen Scientists with my collaborator Professor Ruby Mendenhall;
  - \$100,000 Chancellor’s Anti-Racism Grant at UIUC to explore the racial impacts nationally of access to justice during COVID-19;
  - Intergovernmental Agreement with the Illinois Department of Human Services – awarded to IGPA after a competitive Request for Proposals process – currently in final shaping and negotiation at between \$1.2 and \$1.6 million over two years.
- Implemented a new model of scholarly engagement on a hugely expanded footprint, including launching a fourth Working Group on Equity, Justice, and Human Flourishing
- Transformed IGPA from a closed panel of 11 Senior Scholars in 2018 working from a discrete set of disciplines to now engaging more than 150 scholars through four Working Groups, 33 as Collaborating Scholars working on interdisciplinary teams
- Facilitated 6,722 relationships between scholars across all three universities
- “Branded” our 33 Collaborating Scholars with individualized microsites
